



Pre-Departure

- Is your mobile phone on LOUD?
- Do you know where the emergency equipment is located?
- Have you watched the safety video?

Returning to Jetty

- All passengers to be seated.
- Approach slowly with the front of the boat towards the jetty.
- Listen to instructions from the crew.

Emergency Procedures

Engine Failure

1. Drop Anchor
2. Call emergency number

Man Overboard

1. STOP QUICKLY
2. Turn around DO NOT REVERSE
3. Turn upwind to pick up MOB
4. Recover MOB on windward side

There is a fire extinguisher and first aid kit on board, as well as a life buoy and lifejacket for every passenger.

NO WAKE



NO WASH

Maximum 5 knots in built up areas. No wake or wash

RED & GREEN STAY BETWEEN

Whilst travelling away from the jetty the green markers should be on your left.

Whilst travelling towards the jetty the green markers should be on your right.

Boats are driven on the RIGHT opposite to the road. Oncoming boats will pass on your left!

EXCLUSION AREAS

- Sand bars & shallows, keep between the channel markers.
- The canals inside the Marina.
- The Ocean.



Plan Your Trip

Please be courteous and ensure you allow sufficient time to be back at the jetty and to disembark by the end of your hire ready for the next group to enjoy their hire time.

Location	Outbound	Inbound
Ravenswood Hotel	1.5 hrs	2 hrs
Dawesville Cut	1.5 hrs	2 hrs
Boundary Island	25 mins	30 Mins

Rules

- 1.No smoking or littering.
- 2.Respect the dolphins, keep your distance, if they choose to interact, slow down and do not circle or chase them.
- 3.Keep all limbs inside the vessel.
- 4.No climbing on the roof or canopy!

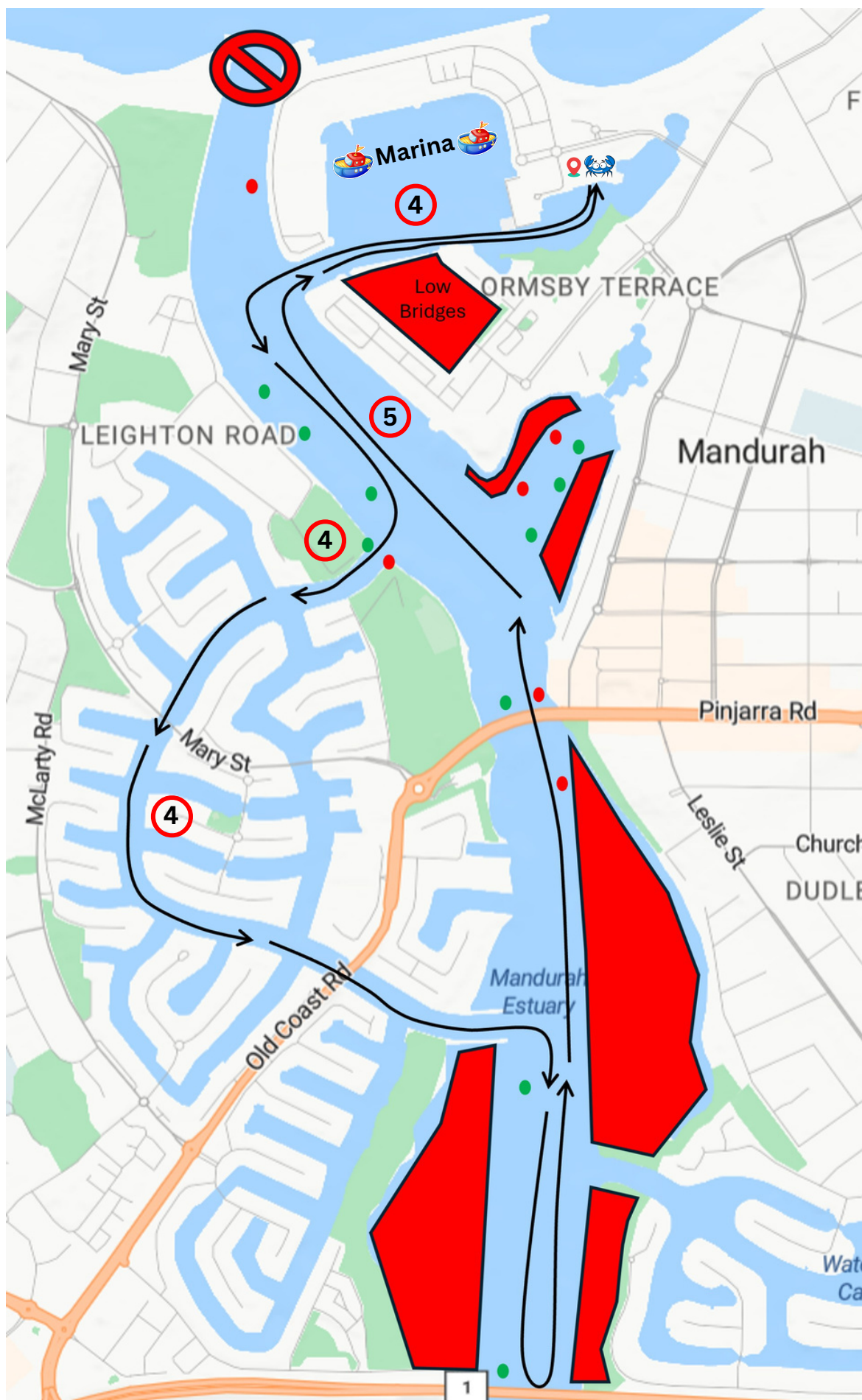

1.5 Hour Hire Suggested Route



-  Exclusion Zones - Ocean, Shallows, and Low Bridges
-  Speed Limit. 5 in open areas, 4 in the Marina and Canals
-  Channel Marks - Remember **RED** & **GREEN** IN BETWEEN!



Venetian Canals

DANGER!

Please do not enter the Venetian Canals due to their low bridges!

Entering the Venetian Canals will incur fines and / or loss of bond, and potentially damage the boat.



EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Fire

1. Isolate fire (e.g. switch engine off)
2. Isolate fuel if safe to do so
3. Call MBH Emergency number
4. Everyone should don a lifejacket
5. Muster away from any potential dangers
6. Be prepared to abandon ship if the fire is out of control

Loss of Steering

1. Drop the anchor if safe to do so
2. Call MBH Emergency number for assistance

Loss of Propulsion

1. Drop the anchor if safe to do so
2. Call MBH Emergency number for assistance

Master Incapacitated

1. Drop the anchor
2. Call MBH Emergency number for assistance
3. Consider following emergency procedures for Medical Emergency if required

Medical Emergency

1. Call 000
2. Follow the instructions of 000 operator
3. Call MBH Emergency number for additional assistance
4. Navigate to a jetty or meeting point for emergency services as required.

Collision

1. Ensure there is no further risk to passengers or the vessel
2. Find a safe place to stop either a jetty or drop the anchor.
3. Call MBH Emergency number for assistance or to report the incident immediately.

Flooding

1. Everyone should don a life jacket
2. Navigate the vessel towards your nearest jetty and disembark the vessel
3. Call MBH Emergency number for assistance
4. If there is no jetty close by, consider a shallow sandbar to ground the vessel on

Grounding

1. Drop the anchor
2. Call the MBH Emergency number for assistance

Man Overboard

1. Put the boat into neutral, do NOT put the boat in reverse
2. Throw life buoy and have someone keep an eye on the MOB
3. Turn vessel around and collect MOB downwind
4. Call the MBH Emergency number for assistance

Oil or Fuel Spill

1. Attempt to isolate or minimise any spillage as is safe to do so
2. Call MBH Emergency number for assistance

Adverse Weather

1. Begin heading to your nearest safe jetty or the MBH office
2. Call the MBH Emergency number for assistance

Other

1. If your situation is not covered in the above scenarios.
2. Consider the safety of all passengers onboard first
3. Contact MBH Emergency number for assistance
